1	<p>Welcome, Introductions and Apologies</p> <p>The members confirmed LP as Convener for this meeting.</p> <p>The Chair welcomed members and attendees; apologies were received as detailed above.</p>		
2	<p>Declarations of Interest</p> <p>None</p>		
3	<p>Quorum</p> <p>As the required quorum was met, the Convener declared the meeting open.</p>		
4	<p>Minutes from last meeting on 05/06/19</p> <p>The minutes from the previous meeting were not available for members to view and will be circulated following the meeting to confirm they are an accurate record of the meeting.</p>	LPa	27/09/19

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5	<p>Action Log:</p> <p>Action log up to date with three ongoing actions open.</p> <p>10. Dates of next meeting as agreed to be published on CCG website.</p> <p>13. Members to be sent links to Surrey Downs, North West Surrey and Guildford and Waverley websites with a survey within 3 months of software going live that makes website more accessible is implemented, for review and feedback. However, due to a proposed merger of the three CCGs and East Surrey CCG, this work will not take place until 2020 as a new, single website would be developed should the merger go ahead.</p> <p>15. Minutes will be loaded on to the SDCCG website</p>		
6	<p>Updates from Stakeholders</p> <p>Independent Mental Health Network for Surrey and North East Hampshire:</p> <p>EL highlighted the current working group looking at the succession plan at Surrey County addressing the changes to the section 75 agreement. Explaining that the working group has met on several occasions now and notes will be available shortly. Where members have an interest in being involved they should contact Guy Hill - Independent Mental Health Network.</p> <p>AS confirmed Siobhan Abernathy Surrey County Council discussed the changes to Section 75 at recent Surrey Coalition of Disabled People meeting. EL clarified that the changes to Section 75 are in relation to social workers who were previously sited with Surrey and Borders Partnership NHS Foundation Trust being located in Surrey County Council sites, following decision made around the best way to utilise resources by bringing the source of care back into Surrey County Council. EL confirmed the changes should not be felt at user level, furthermore the changes should improve future services.</p>		

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	<p>EL raised concerns around the alcohol prevention policy and strategy, suggesting Surrey County Council could look at improvements at a local level including focusing on known Surrey Downs “hotspots”. EL raised concerns that the strategy for Surrey does not feel ambitious enough in this area, suggesting there should be a greater focus on early intervention and prevention.</p> <p>LPa requested clarification from EL regarding the specific points raised around Surrey Downs “hotspots” EL detailed a study completed, approximately a year ago on health statistics in Surrey Downs, the final paper of the study focused on hospital admissions and highlighted community interventions as a tool for preventing admissions. EL suggested that alcohol use is a symptom of other Mental Health conditions, as there is such prevalence in this co-existence, there should be more integration between these services to improve health outcomes and wellbeing for the local population.</p> <p>ASm Highlighted a current piece of work for the Urgent and Integrated Care team looking at why people attend A&E locally; within this there will be a focus on alcohol. 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	<p>Healthwatch Surrey:</p> <p>KN highlighted the following reports recently released by Healthwatch Surrey: Care Homes Report, Care at Home Report, and the Learning Disabilities Insight Report. Drawing attention to vulnerable patients feeling scared about the availability of their medication. DF queried what actions the CCG are taking to support GP practices. DF highlighted another concern around the withdrawal of some local GP services like micro suction, patients are being signposted to Specsavers where it's £35 per ear.</p> <p>YB commented that the removal of microsuction services is consistently mentioned at the hard of hearing forum, some GP practices are providing the service and charging.</p> <p>LPa addressed EU Exit concerns, confirming that the majority of communications are from central government rather than the CCG at this point in time. The AGM will look at supportive technologies, exercise for wellbeing such as rambling with ramblers in attendance. The Coalition aim to create an AGM this year that is interesting as well as business orientated. In addition to this YB raised awareness with members that the Surrey Coalition office has been set up with assistive technologies that people can come and try out. In addition to this Surrey Coalition is seeking 20 people to trial some assistive technologies in the Guildford and Waverley locality.</p> <p>ASm explained that Guildford and Waverley are leading on this, with other councils monitoring progress.</p> <p>KN asked if the Coalition was actively looking for 20 people. The workshop highlighted three key priorities: improving access to advocacy in Surrey Downs; agree how providers of information and advice are going to link in with Primary Care Networks; continuing to combat digital exclusion, ensuring residents have information provided in accessible formats.</u></p> <p><u>SL has also been looking at the role of information and advice with regards to hospital discharge. As part of this, SL has also been working with Healthwatch Surrey about their hospital discharge checklist. . Healthwatch Surrey had received feedback that the original version of their hospital discharge checklist was too cumbersome for staff to use. They have therefore amended it and are interested in gaining feedback as to where else it could be use in the discharge process e.g. (other than in hospital as the patient is about to be discharged) e.g. if it was a planned admission for example, could other services support the completion of this or raise awareness with our residents that this is some of the questions they may like to find out whilst in hospital.</u></p>	YB	04/10/19

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	<p><u>. SL has recently visited the ASC team at Epsom hospital and also attended a Multi-Disciplinary Team meeting to understand how patients are being supported with information and advice about care and support at the discharge stage. .. SL also received some feedback from Epsom Hospital about how they are complying with the NHS Accessible Information Standard.</u></p> <p><u>Adult Social Care Information and Engagement - Surrey County Council:</u></p> <p><u>SL announced there are now online self-referral forms for social care via the Surrey County Council website. It is hoped this will save time, and be a smoother process. At the beginning of July a Surrey Downs action workshop was held, in connection with caring support. The workshop highlighted three key priorities: improving access to advocacy in Surrey Downs; agree how providers of information and advice are going to link in with Primary Care Networks; continuing to combat digital exclusion, ensuring residents have information provided in accessible formats. There has been a recent piece of work around improving discharge from hospitals, with Surrey County Council working in collaboration with Healthwatch Surrey. The improving discharge work focused on areas such as refining check lists, addressing issues such as hospital staff finding the check list process cumbersome, and thinking about different perspectives such as those of Multi-Disciplinary Teams. SL highlighted that following attendance of recent Multi-Disciplinary Team meetings there was reassurance around the work Multi-Disciplinary Teams are doing to improve discharge. SL announced that Surrey County Council is reviewing the Accessible Information Standard and what is available with local healthcare providers, with a recent focus on Epsom Hospital. A discussion has taken place with Epsom Hospital focusing on their website.</u></p>		

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	<p>Epsom and Ewell Age Concern</p> <p>DMH raised concerns regarding the available local infrastructure to 'service' the increase in referral through the social prescribing. She reported that VCF colleagues are feeling left behind in terms of adequate resourcing e.g. in Epsom ICP GP practice in Ewell and the supporting Primary Care Network. Local charities such as Citizens Advice Bureau, Age Concern, Central Surrey Voluntary Action and Mary Frances, are currently all receiving referrals but without additional funding. Questioning the logic of social prescribers being funded but not the organisations involved in receiving the referrals. DMH feels that the increase seems erratic rather than consistent, and seems to be from certain GPs and not others. DMH wondered if this would change once the funding sits with the Primary Care Networks. In addition to this DMH noted the VCF sector felt very involved at the beginning of the social prescribing processes being established, however they now feel there is limited communication.</p> <p>YB echoed the same points raised around social prescribing and VCF not feeling involved or communicated with.</p> <p>SL highlighted the Guildford and Waverley social prescribers' network forum as a potential model whereby social prescribing could be better supported and 'mainstreamed'. SL suggested contacting Carol Dunnett at Voluntary Action South West Surrey and suggested that perhaps one of the leads for social prescribing could help to facilitate a forum like this in Surrey Downs.</p> <p>SL highlighted the Guildford based social prescribers' network forum as a potential model whereby social prescribing could be better supported and 'mainstreamed'. 7	<p>Falls Prevention Pack and Winter Planning:</p> <p>ASm discussed the Falls Prevention Project, explaining that the CCG commissions a falls prevention service, which works with people who have already fallen, with the CCG seeking to expand this service to have a greater focus on prevention. ASm highlighted the Falls Prevention Pack which is now available for anyone at risk. The pack is intended to be used as a tool for discussion with a practitioner rather than given as a hand-out. The information is currently broken down into the four boroughs for ease and includes a link to Active Surrey and Surrey Information Point due to the frequency that the information provided on local classes changes.</p> <p>ASm is seeking feedback from members regarding the content and presentation of the Falls Prevention Pack. In addition to this ASm is seeking feedback on the distribution list: do members feel this is up to date and reflects the relevant parties who would benefit from the packs.</p>		

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	<p>DMH confirmed the packs seem well presented. They often get queries on falls prevention, and have two home visitors who could benefit from knowing about the packs.</p> <p>LP understood the logic of using a link to keep information as up to date as possible but also raised concerns around the need to be mindful of people who are not comfortable accessing information in this way.</p> <p>EL questioned the efficiency of joined up pathways for people highlighted as a risk. ASm confirmed this kind of pathway would be directed by the GP, to lead on a care plan with the district nursing team who would communicate with South East Coast Ambulance Service, and the falls team provided via Surrey Downs Health and Care Partnership. ASm confirmed this partnership is analysing frequent faller data. EN asked to see this data.</p> <p>ASm explained the Falls Prevention Project considers people of all ages with conditions such as Multiple sclerosis (MS) as well as older patients. KN commented that sharing the Falls Pack with specialist nurses would be beneficial. EL questioned how this project is responding to falls prevention in hospitals. ASm explained that would be a duty of care on the hospital to look at preventing these, for example NEECH uses a wrist band systems. 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	<p>Practices vote to approve the proposal, NHS England would need to review the plans and provide overall approval.</p> <p>SL suggested the merger would have both pros and cons, with a perceived benefit of consistency across the localities, with things such as the website, and saving on duplication.</p> <p>LPa commented that the potential merger should not impact at patient level. Noticeable changes would be seen in the CCGs having one consistent brand, name and website, which would reduce duplication.</p> <p>There was discussion in the room around the need to ensure primary care services are improved for the local population, and concerns regarding the potential merger impacting on these services. Members would like to have an understanding of what the guiding principles will be, and how this will translate into services that support quality of life and wellbeing. Members were keen to know how they can be involved and support the developing Integrated Care Partnerships.</p> <p>LPa explained that the developing Surrey Downs Integrated Care Partnership is where the involvement of patients, in the design and creation of services would be key and that how this important function would be incorporated is part of the developing arrangements for ICPs and Primary Care Networks.</p> <p>ACTION</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Request Surrey Downs Integrated Care Partnership Director attends next PAN to discuss patient and public engagement in the new structure.
